Home Learning:

Home learning will be displayed weekly in class and graded weekly unless otherwise noted. Students should also stay up to date and aware of any changes made through Google Classroom. Students are expected to manage their time wisely, particularly with long term assignments like those required through vocabulary.com and NoRedInk.
