Ceramics - Course – Overview

Students are taught fundamentals in the visual arts in the area of ceramics. Methods of hand building, such as coil, pinch, slab, glaze application, and firing processes, are explained. Elements of good design are emphasized through the construction of clay objects to develop a sense of aesthetics and individual expression within the student. Advanced students are given specific problem-solving assignments that stress elements and principles of design, the use of the potter's wheel, glaze compositions, and advanced techniques such as spouts, handles, and lids. Aesthetics and individual expression are stressed. The art portfolio is encouraged at this level.
